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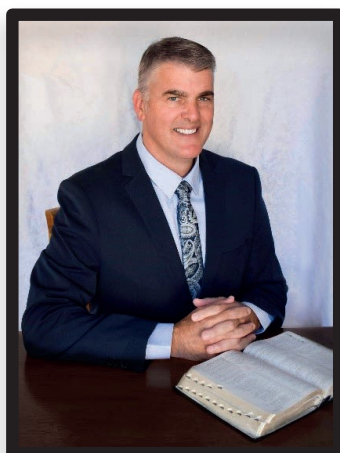
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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Carers and Families of Emmanuel,

Welcome back to Term 3 and the ministry of Emmanuel Christian Community School.

As we hear of what is happening in other parts of the world, and in parts of our own country, we can feel blessed that in WA we are able to live relatively normal lives by continuing to be alert and proactive regarding COVID-19.



Following the advice of the Chief Medical Officer and State Government guidelines, we are still in Phase 4 restrictions and continuing a strict hygiene and cleaning regime at Emmanuel, which has enabled us to continue full attendance and face to face teaching.

We may know of family or friends that have been affected more significantly because of COVID-19. They may be suffering or in need due to the circumstances they find themselves in.

What should our response be?

Jesus' ministry showed immense compassion towards those who were sick, suffering, or in poverty.

These Christ-like actions not only met a very practical need, but also attracted many outsiders to Christianity.



But the biggest similarity, is the response of Christians. This is the time for Christians and Christian institutions to shine by showing the love of Christ to those who most need to know His love and compassion.

Can such faith save them? 15 Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. 16 If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? 17 In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. James 2:14-17 (NIV)

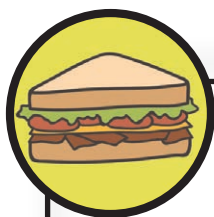


YEAR 7: CITY VISIT

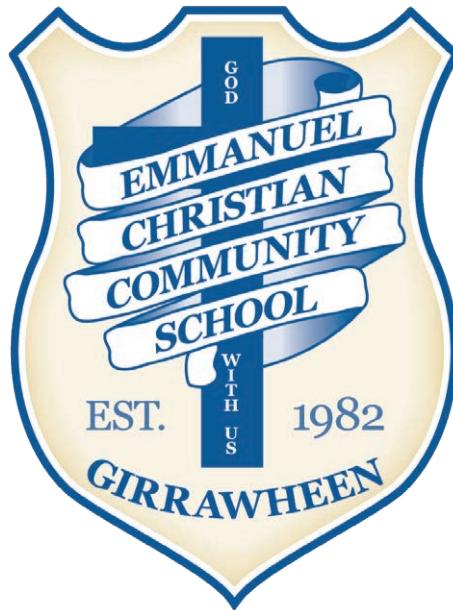
